The academic year 2019-20, witnessed a of plethora of activities that aimed at continuous improvement and promotion of quality culture.


The quality initiatives by IQAC include the following:


- **A National level Interdisciplinary Seminar on "Understanding Indian Cinema" by the Department of Sociology.**



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



In addition, we have the following quality initiatives

- To sustain Student representation on academic and administrative bodies/committees of the institutions- larger representation of Students on the CDC, IQAC, CWE, Magazine committee, Green club etc.
- A Mental Well Being Programme, involving group counselling for all students and individual counselling for students who need it, with three counsellors available on the campus at all times.



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- An innovative teaching methodology: an international online collaboration learning COIL between New York, Lahore, Dhaka and St Mira's.
- Activities & initiatives of CWE to promote entrepreneurship & innovation among the students of the college
- Adopting Quality Enhancement Strategies for initiating mentoring across all classes
- Adopting quality enhancement framework to develop LOCF based curriculum-The credits calculation of the university has changed for the award of the final degree. It was considered that in the revision of the syllabus from the coming year would have to be designed keeping these credits in mind. A workshop on LOCF was proposed to be held for the faculty in January, to familiarize them with the credit system-.
- To strengthen the registrations for the alumni association, increase alumni activity and alumni funding
 - A 6-day long Students Induction Programme with the objective of acclimatizing students to the college.
 - To institutionalize a fund for seed money to be given to teachers from the non-grant section for their PhDs.
 - To strengthen the extension activities of the college and focusing on two major projects where involvement is across departments
 - A variety of certificate and extra credit courses have been introduced to develop skills and enhance employability.
 - We continue to strengthen and maintain our earlier collaborations with institutions of excellence like the Women's Studies Centre, SPPU
 - A variety of internships were provided to students for content writing, editing, or at the Intelligence Plus Pvt Ltd, iTeach School, the Borderless World Foundation in Kashmir and Chartered Accountancy firms in Pune.
 - The collaborations with TISS Mumbai, Tata Consultancy and ATS learning solutions for Microsoft certifications still going strong.
 - To further fine tune the feedback system on curriculum from students; teachers, alumni and employers. To include offline qualitative feedback subject wise. Analysis will be forwarded to teachers for use in curriculum development and design
 - In addition to academics our students actively participated in zonal, state, national and international competitions

- **REPORTS OF IQAC QUALITY INITIATIVES:**

- **Student Induction Programme (SIP)-**


A 6-day long Students Induction Programme with the objective of acclimatizing students to the college surroundings and building a rapport among the teachers and students. Keeping in accordance with the directives from the UGC, the orientation will focus on developing sensitivity towards social issues and work to instill human values among students across all UG programs. The students were briefed on the different streams available for the Graduate and Post Graduate programmes, autonomy status granted to the College, subjects offered, choice-based credit system and credit courses, details of the examination pattern; internal and external examination; regular and backlog exam rules, re-verification and revaluation. This was followed by a session on LMS-Moodle and Mentoring, orientation about NSS, Green Club and social outreach activities. These sessions aimed at Holistic Development through interactions between the mentor and the mentees, among the students, making students aware about the college system, group counselling and guiding the students relating to their personal, family, financial and academic issues.

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


- **Extra Credit Course:**

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- **GREEN INITIATIVES**





- **Centre for Women Entrepreneurship (CWE)**

This year the college has focused on year-long activities with various organisation in order to bring about a more sustained and hence meaningful impact to their lives.


Project Pandita: As a tribute to our beloved Dada JP Vaswani, the Department of Business Studies entered into collaboration in 2018 with 'Majhi Maitrin Charitable Trust', an NGO working for upliftment of women from underprivileged sections of society focusing on empowering women via 'Project Pandita', in Kanyashala, Dehu, Pune for two years in a row.




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
Spherule Foundation: Students of the Accounts Department joined hands with the Spherule Foundation for conducting awareness drives on menstrual hygiene in PMC schools.



Deep Griha Society: They helped in raising Donations in kind for Adult Education Program of Deep Griha Society.



- **SPORTS:**
