**1. Y-break or Yoga Break Session on "5 minutes Yoga Protocol" – 23 April 2022**




**2. Activities for Yoga – 17 May 2022**



The videos were also shared with them for ready access. 18 volunteers participated in this session.



### 3. International Yoga Day Celebration 21<sup>st</sup> June 2022

Har Ghar Tiranga - Rally with Botanical Survey of India – 10<sup>th</sup> August 2022






**5. Webinar on India's Freedom Struggle- 13<sup>th</sup> August 2022**

Annual Regular Activities Report – 2021-22


1. Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav –April 2021 - Celebrating 75 Years Of India's Independence - Webinar on 'India's Freedom Struggle – An Overview'


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2. Virtual Photo Exhibition – on freedom Fighters and Places of Historical Significance



3. Report- COVID-19 Vaccination Mahotsav -11<sup>th</sup> April to 14<sup>th</sup> April 2021

The NSS Department of St. Mira's College actively participated in COVID -19 Vaccination Mahotsav. The College organized an awareness campaign as a part of this Mahotsav. The following activities were taken throughout this period:

1. COVID-19 Vaccination Awareness through Government posters - These were posted on various social media platforms to encourage people to take vaccination and to spread awareness about it. In this



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activity total 25 students participated and reached 2,422 people.

2. **Encouraging people to take vaccination of COVID-19** - Total 6 family members of the volunteers took vaccination for COVID-19.
3. **Helping senior citizens with vaccination process** - (Online form filling, counselling and clearing their doubts.) 5 Online forms were filled and 5 people were given counselling about benefits of vaccination.

#### 4. **CRSA Work – 19<sup>th</sup> April 2021 to 5<sup>th</sup> June 2021**

CRSA i.e. Covid Resource Student Association is an organization run by students to help people in dire need of Covid resources by providing verified and well researched data. During this time of uncertainty and noise, The Covid Resource Student Association was committed to being in the front-line to help provide resource. It was important to conduct such a campaign simply because it was the need of the hour. CRSA wanted to help people with verified information, so that instead of running around for resources, people could attend to the needs of their loved ones. It was also set up with the intention of boosting people' morals since the association couldn't be directly involved in supplying resources.

Urvi Shetty, a sociology student at St. Mira's College, Pune, launched Covid Resource Student Association (CRSA) in association with Taarini Das and Karuna Das. The project officially began on the 19th of April 2021. A group of 35 NSS volunteers from St Mira's College joined hands to work together with CRSA to do their bit in helping the country heal and get through these trying times. Together they were working on helping COVID patients and their families to get access to resources like medicines and injections keeping the government regulations in mind, real-time availability of ICU and oxygen beds, plasma donors, tiffin facilities, ambulance services to name a few. In this endeavour, the NSS volunteers group helped them in the data collection and verification of the data across the country. In a short span of forty five days, the volunteer team succeeded in helping over 2000 patients. The team helped patients not only from Pune but also from the cities like Agra, Bengaluru, Delhi, Mumbai, Jaipur, Jhansi and Dehradun etc. through various social media platforms. The messages that the volunteers received from people thanking them for leads, resources or even some moral support, is what kept them encouraged and motivated to keep helping people every day.

5. **'World No Tobacco Day Pledge' - 31<sup>st</sup> May, 2021** - The Department of NSS organized a pledge taking activity on World No Tobacco Day - 31<sup>st</sup> May 2021. This was observed in accordance with the World Health Organization (WHO) and global partners as directed by University Grants Commission (UGC-Western Region Office). Students, Teachers along with the Non-teaching Staff, Sevaks and Sevikas pledged not to consume tobacco in any form and to restrain others from the use of tobacco. Awareness was also created among the staff against the harmful and deadly effects of tobacco use and passive exposure to smoking. This was done in line with the theme for this year of 'Commit to Quit'. 60 students, 5 teachers, 8 non-teaching staff and 8 Sevaks and Sevikas together participated in this activity. The pledge taking was organized following strict adherence to Govt. guidelines and protocols on Covid-19.



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


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

- To encourage people living in society and communities to contribute as active representatives in this campaign.
- To motivate people to clean up the surrounding areas for better start of this campaign with our NSS volunteers as ambassadors.



Following activities were undertaken to mark this day:

- 2 Videos were shown to the students – One video was by the JeevitNadi Foundation – ‘The Story of a River’ – which shared the condition of the Mula-Mutha river then and now. Since this river is in Pune it created awareness among the students of how important it is to keep the river clean for protecting the biodiversity of this city. The second video was on ‘Importance of Tree Plantation’ – shown to create awareness on the importance of Oxygen against the background of the Covid-19 Pandemic. – 42 students participated in this.

She said, “I have started using menstrual cup from last week since a sanitary pad takes more than 500 yrs to decompose and approximately one woman uses about 10000 pads in her entire life. - Vaishnavi Kshirsagar shared the idea of planting a tree on birthdays of each family member. She has so far planted 300 trees in her garden and also planted one more on this occasion to mark the World Environment Day.
- Teaching and Non-teaching Staff were encouraged to clean their emails – for this a post shared by Bhavika, an NSS volunteer was forwarded to them to help them realise the necessity of deleting




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unnecessary emails which contributes to polluting the environment. – We reached 50 staff members through this post.




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

9. **7<sup>th</sup> International Yoga Day, 21<sup>st</sup> June 2021**- St. Mira's College for Girl's virtually celebrated the 7<sup>th</sup> International Yoga Day on 21<sup>st</sup> June 2021 due to the Covid-19 pandemic situation. To create awareness among the students and staff, the Department of Physical Education and Sports and the Dept. of NSS had organised an online Practical Session along with Yoga Pyramids Demonstration by the students. NSS volunteer Sai Kachare and sports students Sheetal Mahadik and Rutuja Kawade participated in the demonstrations. Total 205 students and staff members actively participated on Google meet and Facebook live platforms. This year the theme of the Yoga Day was " Be with Yoga, Be at Home ". Yoga is a very important and useful activity in this pandemic situation which we can perform in less space and it boosts



**10. Panel Discussion on Eliminating Use of Plastic – 25<sup>th</sup> June 2021 - Green Club and NSS Department held a Panel Discussion on 25<sup>th</sup> June 2021 between 10am to 11.15 am on Google meet.**

The dialogue began with introducing the topic- Miss Shannon R talked about what goes around comes around. Ocean throws garbage (created by us ) back to us, so it is our collective responsibility to reduce garbage as much as possible. Miss Rakhi pointed out that it takes about 4000 years for plastic to degrade, hence we should say “No” to use of polythene bags. Miss Namrata Datta added to this discussion regarding reusable H2O bottle plus cloth bags- At present, plastic use is choking us and We are the change makers, need determination to bring the change. Miss MaitrayeeSangitrao highlighted how everywhere plastics are used right from makeup/spectacles. She concluded by asking audience these questions- Do we need it, is it necessary?? We must decide how much plastic to be used in everyday life.

Miss Gauri Raje stated that change begins at home - we must adopt zero plastic-based lifestyle, however challenging it is. She gave examples of using bamboo brush, upcycling old clothes, not to cut plastic pouches completely to avoid microplastics, encouraged to use menstrual cups. Miss Saloni Kullar spoke about human beings at our best are extremely creative, she added to switch to ink pens, cut gel pens can be used as beads, plastic stand of pens stuck together etc. Miss Annmariya said that plastic creates scarcity of land , alternative is use metal straw. Miss Kajal Yadav coaxed all to buy bigger bottles to avoid using more of plastic consumption. Miss Riya Pawar spoke about how plastic tiffin boxes can be reused as jewellery boxes, use cloth flowers, use paper cups, etc. Miss Anushka said that living a simple life is not easy but everyone can do it. Miss Aariya Parve shared here ideas of the various means to cut down plastic such as use of paper glasses, wire hangers etc.

Audience participation showed an overwhelming response to this discussion. Miss Kanishka informed to use steel items for milk cans. Miss Nivedita Sahoo suggested use of wooden items in the kitchen. Miss Shannon encouraged audience to use cotton based sanitary towels, use metals instead of paper because trees are being harmed, use paper bags which are made out of newspapers. Miss Rajni Singh, Inhouse faculty said that be responsible consumers , make producers to rethink



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


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the use of plastic material for packaging and at the end Miss Gauri discussed the taboo relating to Menstrual cups.



This webinar was about skill enhancement of the youth and in this webinar importance of New Education Policy for skill-based development was told. Total 20 students participated in this webinar.

**16. Social Service Activity at Aundhe and Dongargaon, Khandala – 13<sup>th</sup> Aug 2021** – This Activity was organised by our parent body, Sadhu Vaswani Mission. A heavy downpour, unpaved, wet muddy roads, and poor living conditions with kaccha houses; that's the khandala our volunteers witnessed. Ration kits included wheat flour, rice, dal, pulses, poha/sabudana/suji, sugar, spices, tea and 1litre cooking oil. The ration could last an average family for a month.

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
### 17. Swachhata Pakhwada – 1<sup>st</sup> Aug to 15<sup>th</sup> Aug 2021

#### 8<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> August- Slogan, Poetry writing and Poster making



each.



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

**21. PoshanMaah – 1<sup>st</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2021 –**

**a. Theme: Converging towards a healthy walk through life- कूपोषणछेडपोषणकीओर**

– थामेक्षेत्रीयभोजनकीडोर - Under the guidance of the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Ministry of Youth and Sports, Govt. of India and the NSS Department, SPPU, St Mira's College for Girls, Pune organized various activities for the PoshanMaah to be observed from 1 September to 30 September 2021. **c. Workshop on demonstration for setting up of a Kitchen Garden and Benefits of Organic Food – 11 September, 2021** - The basic needs in our lives- Sujalam (clean water), Suphalam (healthy crop) and Malayajshitalam (fresh air). These are the important aspects in our lives that contribute to our existence. Unfortunately, these things are declining due to the rapid increase in human population and irresponsible usage of the resources done by them. Promoting organic farming has become more important now. Dr. Rupali Sheth, NSS PO, Huzurpaga College is a live example of this as she grows such

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healthy food crops and vegetables in her garden that are not only nutritious and healthy but also eco-friendly and refreshing. She informed the volunteers of some of the ecofriendly ways to avoid harm to the environment by preparing the compost at home, and engaging in Organic farming. She also informed the volunteers of the advantages of organic farming are immense and encouraged each one to do so. 35 NSS volunteers participated in this workshop.



**d. Yoga for building immunity - 15 September, 2021** - We organised an online Practical Chair Yoga Session for the NSS volunteers targeting adolescent girls. This was done in accordance with Covid-19 norms and protocol followed. 15 volunteers actively participated in the live practical session which was conducted by our college Director of Physical Education, Mrs. Ekta Jadhav. 
**27. Vigilance Awareness Campaign- 26<sup>th</sup> October 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> October 2021**

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



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**e. A Session on "Financial Literacy Awareness" under Yuva Saptah- Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav – 18th January 2022**


a. **Selfies with Mother** - Through selfies students reached 1,569 beneficiaries to create awareness.


### My Green Bappa 2020 by The Green Club



The Green Club of St. Mira's College for Girls, Pune organized a National Webinar on **#Rebooting MotherEarth** on Saturday, 27<sup>th</sup> June 2020 between 2.00pm to 4.00pm.

The idea of this Webinar was mooted at a time of the COVID19 pandemic induced nationwide lockdown. This lockdown worsened the economic condition of many, especially migrant population; exacerbating their suffering; but seemed to have had a positive impact on the environment. Reduced vehicular traffic on roads, ban on air travel, limited fishing, closure of industries lead to a drop in air and water pollution to some extent. Cleaner air and water also had a positive impact on vegetation. This made us reflect on the conflict between economic growth and environmental preservation.


This Webinar was a brainchild of St. Mira College's Green Club- a voluntary initiative of faculty and students, working towards promoting the 3Rs- "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle" through advocacy and engagement. It was the firm belief of the Organizing Committee that this webinar would serve to awaken 'green' consciousness of society, extend the process of preserving biodiversity and inculcate in civil society, the idea of giving back to Nature. This rationale was in conformity with the Vision of our revered founder, Sadhu T.L. Vaswani and our Spiritual Mentor, Dada J.P. Vaswani, who as educationalists, believed in a holistic education, involving the triple training of the Head, Hand and the Heart.

It was also felt that this Webinar would serve as a suitable platform to highlight the link between planetary health and societal health. Our intent was to highlight the fact that while the pursuit of economic activity is necessary as a means of livelihood; it need not be at the cost of our environment. We thus, wanted this Webinar to provide a focus on mitigation and adaptation actions so that we, as humans, could align our behaviour to the carrying capacity of Planet Earth.

The Webinar commenced with the Coordinator, Prof. Rajni Singh's Welcome and Opening Remarks. She then read out Principal, Dr. G.H. Gidwani's Address, which focused on the need to preserve Nature's Bounty for posterity and for sustainable development. Dr. Shalini Iyer, Convenor of the Webinar, presented an Introduction of Green Club and the rationale of the Webinar. Prof. Jyoti Chintan introduced the Resource Persons

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The first session was on the theme: “**Circular Economy**”. The resource person was **Mr. Siddharth Naik**, a Solid Waste Management Consultant and a ‘*Hatkar Punekar*’ who practises what he preaches. During the course of his talk, Mr Naik stressed on the need for a mindset change and an acceptance of the fact that waste management is every citizen’s responsibility. Mr. Naik dwelled on many practical everyday solutions which could be adopted for successful waste management. These included three-way waste-segregation by residential societies, bringing in lifestyle changes like using steel instead of glass crockery, acquiring new habits like BYOC-‘bring your own cup’, revisiting the materialistic and wasteful Gifting Culture and doing away with the ‘Use and Throw’ approach. He dispelled myths about so-called ‘eco-friendly’ products like paper cups [which are reinforced with plastic to make them durable and heat-resistant.]

The resource person for the second session was **Mr. Niranjan Upasani**, a Sustainable Living Life Coach and Founder Director of the NGO-‘Jeevit-nadi.’ He spoke on “**Sustainable Living**”. Mr. Upasani spoke extensively about rebooting earth after the pandemic and reiterated the valid arguments marshalled by Mr. Naik. Mr. Upasani urged all to make a behavioural switch from ‘consume to conserve’ in order to protect and preserve Mother Earth. With the help of daily life examples, he illustrated the true meaning of ‘Rebooting Mother Earth.’ His discussion on the natural environment encompassed the importance of maintaining the quality of soil, water and air for a sustainable human existence.

The two resource persons highlighted the need for internalising these sustainable practices and embedding them in our daily life. Thus, only by accepting joint responsibility of our actions and through collaborative effort, we can make a transition towards: Rebooting Mother Earth. Mahatma Gandhi’s words can then come alive: “Be the Change you wish to see in the World.” The Power of Change is thus, in our Hands.

The Webinar drew to a conclusion with a Vote of Thanks presented by Prof. Deepanjali Mazumdar. The Webinar drew 150 participants representing a motley group of faculty and students from different states of India including U.P, Rajasthan, Manipur, Karnataka, Punjab, M.P. Gujarat and of course, our very own, Maharashtra. The Webinar was well-received with the participants asking interesting questions during the chat sessions. They also offered positive and encouraging feedback. E-certificates were mailed to all the participants.




Figure 1 Green Club introduction by Dr. Shalini Iyer




Figure 2 Mr Siddharth Naik presenting on Circular Economy

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


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

**Annual Report – Regular Activities – 2020-21 (COVID-19 Pandemic Year)**

**1. COVID-19 Awareness 2020 - 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2020**

NSS Department of St. Mira's College actively participated in Awareness Creating Programme. College organized/ participated in following activities throughout this period.

- a) Total 94 volunteers attended training in English or Marathi. Out of total 56 students attended training in Marathi and remaining 38 attended it in Hindi.
- b) 14 videos creating awareness about corona were uploaded on youtube by 12 NSS volunteers and total 15 posters digital and handmade were made by 14 volunteers.
- c) Almost all the volunteers took pledge to stay at home and to create awareness about Corona virus.
- d) Around 70 NSS volunteers and 2 POs downloaded Arogyasetu app. and uploaded required information.
- e) 70 volunteers have registered themselves as Corona Warriors either on NSS web portal or using telegram app.
- f) Total 69 volunteers made 1176 masks and distributed these masks to the needy people in the vicinity. Sai Kachare made great contribution towards this by making 600 masks and by distributing them to the hospital staff through Bharat Forge company. Another NSS volunteer Pooja Saini too made 100 masks single handedly and donated them.
- g) 59 volunteers made approximately 9.880 liters of handwash/sanitizer at home using available ingredients at home.
- h) 70 volunteers adopted 371 families for creating awareness about corona. Volunteers either went from door to door or contacted these families on whatsapp or through phone call. All the families were informed about the symptoms of corona, precautions to be taken, all the families were surveyed with respect to health issues, use of masks and handwash etc. they were told to download arogyasetu app.
- i) 1 online meeting was conducted on 20<sup>th</sup> April 2020 to orient students about corona awareness. Total 22 volunteers attended the meeting and gave positive response.



**2. 6<sup>th</sup> International Yoga Day, 21st June 2020** - The 6<sup>th</sup> International Yoga Day was celebrated by St. Mira's College for Girl's virtually due to the Covid-19 pandemic situation. The department of Physical Education and Sports had organised an online Practical Webinar on Yoga in two different sessions. The total 148 students and staff members actively participated in the live practical webinar. This year the theme of the Yoga Day was 'Yoga at home, Yoga with Family'. It was conducted by director of Physical Education, Mrs. Ekta Jadhav. The chief guest was our senior most Sports Coach, Maharashtra State Jijamata Awardee Ms. Gurabans Kaur. Followed by practical session which includes prayer, different Yoga posture such as Sukshma Vyayama, Tadasana, Vrukshasana, padahastasana, Ardha Chakrasana, Trikonasana, Bhadrasana, Ardha Ushtrasana, Vajrasana, bhujangasana, Pawanmuktasana, setu bandhasana etc. ended with Kapalbhathi, Anulom Viloma, Bhramari Pranayam and Dhyana.



The speaker for this webinar was Natasha Advani, an international lifestyle success coach and trainee. The webinar was attended by 40 students of St Miras College for Girls, Pune. 
1. **Swachha Waari** - A cleanliness drive was undertaken by the student volunteers in their own houses and localities.






**11. Organ Donation Awareness Campaign Week - 13<sup>th</sup> August to 20<sup>th</sup> August 2020**

2. Offer to do the work of all members above the age of 65 years.
3. FOOD – Eat regularly and ONLY food prepared at Home – NO JUNK FOOD – NO AERATED drinks
4. Wash Hands regularly

5. Wear Mask and Gloves properly
6. AVOID social gatherings – if very important, Maintain Social Distance
7. While returning from outside, Sanitize hands before entering the house, have a bath and wash the clothes immediately.
8. Suggested Steam Inhalation and Salt Water Gargling as effective measures for possible prevention









**b. Integrity Pledge for Citizens -**


**c. Guest Lecture on Anti-Corruption Awareness - 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2020**

**a) ‘Views of Swami Vivekananda and Today’s Youth’ - Speaker for this topic was Ms. Veena Kenchi**



**e) Display of Books on Swami Vivekananda by the Library**






### 33. Report of Road Safety Awareness campaign - 18<sup>th</sup> January to 17<sup>th</sup> February 2021

**b) Poster making and Slogan writing -** In Poster making competition students created handmade posters about the rules of road safety along with slogans. These students posted this on their social media platforms


and created awareness about road safety. 9 Students participated in this competition. Students used government posters also to spread awareness in the community.








### 34. Report of the Guest lecture on Cyber Security Safety Awareness- 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2021

St Mira's College for Girl's, Pune - NSS Department had organized a Guest Lecture on Cyber Security Safety Awareness as a part of the UGC directive regarding implementation of 'Cyber Security Awareness'.

The Guest Speaker was Mr. Vijay Kulkarni, Development Manager from Allscripts India LLP, Pune. Vijay Sir gave the basic introduction about technology and how and for what we use it. He discussed some cases where people can use technology for malpractices, examples such as fraud text messages, emails or spams etc. He actually gave some links to show the difference between real and fraud cases. Students also shared their experiences regarding these cases. At the end he gave small but useful tips to stop the misuse of our information and provided some measures on how we can protect our information. These measures included deleting previous history of that application or browser history, using original software's and applications, frequently changing your passwords, etc. Mr. Kulkarni made this a very interactive session through the use of Polls and use of reactions ensuring active participation of the audience. 63 Students and the staff participated in this Session on Cyber Security. This session was very informative for both the staff and the students to understand why we need to protect our information and how and not fall prey to cyber fraud.



**35. International Women’s Day – 8<sup>th</sup> March** - Guest Lecture by **Renowned Advocate Rama Sarode** on ‘Gender Violence and Judiciary System in India’ - The Department of Sociology and ICC along with NSS department in connection with the International Women’s Day invited renowned woman achiever and Advocate Rama Sarode (Legal consultant and activist) and organized a session on “Gender Violence and the Judiciary System in India”. 100 participants were present for this session.



Advocate Rama Sarode discussed the historical time till now that women needs and the requirements which were not considered for her justice. She discussed several domestic violence cases and other cases and their results to give us the actual scenario of today’s women’s condition. She observed that with new cases new laws are made but still women are not fully aware of it. She suggested that women advocates should be included to understand women issues and this should be done with sensitivity to be able to reach out to more needy women both in the urban and rural setup. She ended her session with question and answers and giving insight about articles regarding women. Many students took active part in the discussion and raised pertinent questions on the topic. Aga Khan Palace went all the way up to Moriga Shoppe and back to Aga Khan Palace. Corona restraining rules were followed during the march.





NASHA UKT BHARAT ABHIYAAN - Webinar on De-addiction of Substances - 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2021, Pune** - The NSS department of St. Mira's College for Girl's held an online Webinar on 'De-addiction of Substances' on 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2021 at 2.00 pm which fell on a Tuesday. There were a total of 54 participants, including the NSS Program Officers - Dr.Sandhya Pandit and Mrs.Manjita Kulkarni. The honorable speaker for the day was Mr.Nihar Hasabnis, a member of 'Muktangan Rehabilitation Centre' which was established in 1986 and is helping people till date and saving numerous lives.



With the growing drug, alcohol, tobacco and hookah use, and increase in crime rates due to the use of excess drugs, the highlight of the session was 'Use, Misuse and Abuse' of the aforementioned substances. This phrase was explained with quite diligence to the students by the speaker. The discussions went from along the lines of types of drugs and it's physiological and psychological effects to the ones those got added to the list due to the Covid-19 situation, that was gadget addiction, social media and the addictions that are frowned upon when spoken in the polite society, sex addiction and pornography. Mr. Nihar also shared his knowledge on the behavioural response of kids brought in for treatment by their parents. Children who are forced to take treatment are more likely to bounce back to the disastrous habits than when they willingly come to get help for themselves.


The session concluded with a question and answer round and the girls participated with great enthusiasm. Various students shared their experiences and encounters with people who highly consume drugs and alcohol and how it not only affects the consumer but everyone around them. Positive ways to relieve stress were also suggested and that no excuse is acceptable for drug abuse if it goes out of control. The webinar ended by Mr. Nihar pointing out to the students that in order to blend with the crowd, drug consumption or a certain kind of behaviour is not necessary and the youth should be aware of the ill effects of drug consumption and help the ones around them who want to change and live a better life. All the NSS volunteers highly appreciated the efforts for organizing this webinar in today's vulnerable and stressful times.




### 38. Poshan Pandharvada – 16 March to 31 March 2021








**b. TASTE VS WAIST - Importance of a Balanced and Nutritious Diet – 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2021**


The entire program was hosted by the NSS volunteers themselves. It began with the welcome address by Ms. Sarah Husainy. A bhajan by Ms. Sakshi


The NSS annual activity report for the year 2020-21, showcasing all the activities carried out by the volunteers during the academic year was presented by Ms. Kirti Kamuni.


premises, their houses, locality clean. The schedule of all the activities of Swachhata Pakhwada was read out to the students and students were encouraged to participate in all the activities.



NSS department with 11 volunteers and 2 teachers went to Sadhu Vaswani Mission's Gurukul School for **tree plantation**. On 20<sup>th</sup> January, volunteers reached the school at 12.15 pm. High CO<sub>2</sub> absorbing plants were chosen for tree plantation. Neem, Peepal, Amala, Saptaparni were planted as they are high CO<sub>2</sub> sequesters and good water purifiers. The suitability of plants in the given ecosystem was also considered. Total 20 saplings – 10 neem, 5 peepal, 3 amala and 2 saptaparni were planted.



Tuesday, 28<sup>th</sup> January, 21 NSS volunteers along with the NSS officers visited **NAB – an NGO** National Association for the Blinds at Khandala as a part of the SwachhataPakhwada. No sooner did the volunteers reach the place, they started cleaning the area. Volunteers were divided into groups and each group was allotted the area for cleaning. Volunteers cleaned the garden area, collected dry and waste garbage separately; they swept the whole garden area including main gate area, grass patches, backside of the medical clinic, etc.



Some girls went to the kitchen for cleanliness. They arranged kitchen neatly, swept the area and cleaned the kitchen. Few volunteers swept the stairs and the corridors. Other girls cleaned their workplaces like weaving section, knitting section, soap-making section, etc. Storage area, rooms and dining hall were cleaned too by the volunteers.

Many volunteers interacted informally with the blind and aged residents of this old age home. They tried to understand the problems of these people; they tried to open them up and shared moments of love and happiness with them.

Interaction of the students with the villagers was also very important part of the program.


Students were instructed to go to the villagers, help them in their day-to-day activities, understand their problems and develop bond with the villagers.

Our mornings in the camp started with prayer i.e. Sanctuary, followed by University Song, NSS Song, Pranayam and exercises.



In the afternoon, the NSS volunteers undertook the Cleaning of Kondhavale Village. They were

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



come to the village and host the students there. Dr. Iyer wished good luck to the students for the camp. Post-inaugural Dr. Chavan interacted with the students and reminded them of their

### Day 3 – 8/12/2019; Sunday

Our mornings in the camp started with prayer i.e. Sanctuary, followed by University Song, NSS Song, Pranayam and exercises.

A Morning Rally in the Village was conducted on 'Swachha Gaon Swachha Bharat' This was followed by a Lecture on 'Mindfulness through Communication Skills' by Prof.



Suhaile Azavedo of St. Mira's College for Girls using practical demonstration to help them understand team work. The take away of this lecture was for the students to realize in life how important it is 'To Respond and Not React'. This proved to be very beneficial throughout the Camp tenure as these were

testing times for the volunteers and they had to prove their mettle by responding to situations and people and not reacting.

Other professors Dr. Snober Sataravala and Ms. Komal Tujare too interacted with the students and motivated and pepped them up by sharing their experiences of living away from families and friends and the importance of 'Service' and the satisfaction one derives from it.

Post Lunch Mr. Jori had come and he took the volunteers around to show them the medieval period Shankara temple and Veergalas which belonged to the Maratha period.

This was followed by making arrangements for water provision for trees planted near the Medieval period temple. The volunteers made pits in the village for the trees planted

to survive and water them as well. The Volunteers really worked hard and made about 15 pits with the help of spades and hoes and cleared the area with the help of sickles. Later the volunteers went to interact with the villagers and conducted a survey of village homes and facilities available with them. These students went from door to door and conducted basic socio-economic survey of the village.

While conducting the survey they also helped them with their daily chores like washing vessels, filling up drinking water, cleaning and chopping vegetables, etc. By this time the students had developed a strong bond with the village women and children.



The volunteers were then given time for Slogan Writing for next day's Morning Rally on 'Health and Nutrition'. Later the girls practiced for the street plays which they had to enact on Tuesday. We ended the day with a mid-week Camp Feedback Session from the students to assess what we were doing right and areas where we can improve to make the remaining days more fruitful. This was a first of its kind initiative taken by the Programme Officers to open the interaction among the students. This platform provided an opportunity for the students to realize how they were reacting to things instead of responding and helped them change their outlook to things completely in the days that followed. This effort was appreciated by the students.

#### Day 4 – 9/12/2019; Monday

Our mornings in the camp started with prayer i.e. Sanctuary, followed by University Song, NSS Song, Pranayam and exercises.

A Morning Rally in the Village was conducted on 'Health and Nutrition'.



Since the Primary school toilet was the only toilet available for the students to use, the volunteers without any complaints, would clean the toilet of the school before the school hours would begin to ensure a clean facility for the school students and teachers. This was a regular activity for the days spent in the village from this day on. A Swachh Gaon Abhiyaan initiative was taken of a different part of the village i.e. Cleanliness of Shankar temple of Shivajis period and also of the temple premises. The volunteers weeded out the wild and dried grasses from the premises. NSS Programme Officer, Dr. Meenal Sumant conducted an Interaction with the volunteers about the NSS objectives and Camp objectives. She made the students realise of the favours we were drawing from the villagers, in terms of provision of stay and water, washroom facilities, garbage disposal, etc. This way we hoped that the volunteers would reduce the waste being created and work towards a better village environment. The Students too shared their own village experience with everyone, and the luxuries we are getting in this village made especially available for us to avoid inconvenience to us. It included applying mehendi for them, games including duck the ball in the bucket, draping saris in a minute – fastest sari first, taking ukhaanas, etc. The elderly women and the Sarpanch too appreciated the activity as it brought a lot of joy and happiness to the women folk. Since the women were busy with cooking and filling water, the girls helped the women with these chores to finish it fast and then come for the fun fair to be able to enjoy the games for them. On this day the girls went on a Mobile diet of a day and got no phones. This effort was highly


### Day 5 – 10/12/2019; Tuesday

Our mornings in the camp started with prayer i.e. Sanctuary, followed by University Song, NSS Song, Pranayam and exercises.

A Morning Rally in the Village was conducted on 'Beti Bachao'.

The morning began with a Guest lecture on 'Health and Nutrition' by Dr. Arvind Sarsambi - He gave the students basic information on what good

health and nutrition is. How health is based on nutrition, he focused on body image- physical, mental, emotional included; importance of carbohydrates, proteins and fats in the diet; how proteins increase muscle strength, carbohydrates is glucose and fat has to be balanced; he also informed them how the same cooking oil is not to be used for a



long time. Keep changing cooking oils, liver is a storehouse of energy, junk food = fermented food, Balanced diet includes water intake - 5 to 6 ltrs, after 6 to 7 hrs sleep drink minimum half to 1 ltr water before getting out of bed - after 3 mths pimples will disappear, hairfall reduces leading to healthy hair, drink when thirsty even if during meals, don't overeat, kab aur kaise khaana chahiye, eat less than ur hunger, eat max 4 times a day, nutrition has a great impact on your mental behavior; a curry with vegetables, dry veg, rice, no repetition of Roti's, sweets once in a



day, min 30 mins exercise everyday, mental exercises are also very important - speak your mind out if u r disturbed, learn to say NO to all BAD Habits and say YES to all physical exercises. The student gave a Vote of thanks as well.

This was followed by an Interaction of students with

Ms. Veena Kenchi and Dr. Manisha Pimpalkhare, professors from St. Mira's College for girls on Values of NSS. Dr. Pimpalkhare also recited a self written poem on 'Service' and importance of service in ones life.

A 'colouring competition' in the Zilla Parishad Primary School was conducted by the volunteers. Students were provided with the pictures and crayons. Volunteers guided the students and helped them to colour the pictures given. Volunteers interacted with the school children; sang poems and rhymes for them. Prizes for this were distributed on the last day of the camp.

On this day the volunteers had also prepared a special meal of 'Pav Bhaji' for the 60 students of the school and 15 students of the Aanganwadi. The students rejoiced at the sight of getting something different and tasty to eat prepared by the volunteers. The happy, smiling and content faces of the children spoke volumes of how much difference a small act of service like this can make to the lives of these children.

The volunteers then Practiced for the Street Play which they had to perform. The evening of the students was enlightened with a Lecture by Mr. Swamiraj Bhise a well-



known social activist from Savitribai Phule Pune University to teach the students on how to set up Street Plays. He made the session extremely interactive and fun-filled for the students to learn from. The volunteers learnt through voice exercises on how to modulate voices to improve the performance. He also judged the student's street

plays, gave feedback and improvised their plays. The final outcome of this improvisation resulted in a tearful and inconsolable response of the students and village audience. Later the Volunteers practiced for the Cultural events to be performed for the next day.

#### Day 6 – 11/12/2019; Wednesday

Our mornings in the camp started with prayer i.e. Sanctuary, followed by University Song, NSS Song, Pranayam and exercises. This was followed by a Visit to the nearby village, Chinchwad gaon for a Morning Rally on 'Gender Equality'. The volunteers created awareness through their slogans on the need to educate girls and teach the boys to respect girls and contribute to the work at home.

Along with this a Cleanliness drive was also undertaken along the way to make the entire region clean and Plastic free. A little farther away from Chinchwad gaon was a dam. The volunteers were taken to Visit the Belavade Dam which was surrounded by lofty mountains and lush green valleys of the Sahyadri mountain range. It was a beautiful sight to behold. The volunteers interacted with villagers passing by and also helped an elderly lady carry the load of her freshly washed clothes back to her house. The Ajji was very touched and overwhelmed with this gesture of the girls. The volunteers felt happy to be able to get a smile on the face of this Ajji. After returning from the dam a Lecture on 'Reiki, Meditation and it's Benefits' by Ms. Manjita Kulkarni from St. Mira's College for Girls was organised. In this lecture Ms. Kulkarni spoke on the basic Chakras in the body, spoke of alertness, spiritual direction, sustainable happiness, motivation out of depression, concentration, 24 points of reiki meditation, etc. She also focused on how this practice helps in memory retention, reduce the effect of bad influences on your life, how healing can be given, vibrations can be cleared, and how you have to believe in what you want, to reach what destiny has in store for you. She also informed the volunteers of the number of health benefits Reiki has and demonstrated the actual 24 points. The highlight of this session was a Group Reiki that was performed on students wherein 25 volunteers participated to experience the power of reiki to reenergize them after a tiring day to feel peaceful again from within. Post this session these volunteers shared experiences of the vibrations they experienced while the reiki was in progress and how they were more at peace with themselves and their surroundings. This way they all were geared up for the Valedictory function and the Cultural programme that was to follow in the evening.


Post lunch the volunteers were given time for preparing for the cultural programme and for performing the street plays for the villagers.




**Day 7 – 12/12/2019; Thursday**




KAR SEVA- AT SADHU VASWANI MISSION

NSS Department of St. Mira's college celebrated 1<sup>st</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> August as Swachhata Pakhawada.





A total of 48 bottles of blood was collected in this blood donation camp.



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


## SURGICAL STRIKE DAY - 29<sup>th</sup> September 2018



The National Unity Day 2018 was celebrated the Department of NSS, Student Development Cell and the Library of St. Mira's College for girls, Pune.


On this occasion, following activities were undertaken-

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

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

### Electoral Day Celebration- 25<sup>th</sup> January 2019, Friday



The discussion included Prime Minister Modi discussing stress management, time management which will help students to develop and take decisions for their future.






## VALEDICTORY FUNCTION

The programme started with invoking the blessings of the almighty by lighting of the lamp, followed by the university song and NSS song.



Primary School at Parodi, the NSS volunteers cleaned the classrooms that were allotted for the camp and helped in setting up kitchen for the camp.





In pre-dinner session the volunteers of both the colleges were engaged in an interactive session of getting to know the fellow volunteers and their motivation for joining NSS.




Day 2 – 10/12/2018; Monday

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
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Post-lunch different groups discussed the topics for streetplays and volunteers of both the colleges practiced for the street play.

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

Day 6 – 14/12/2018; Friday


Our mornings in the camp started with prayer i.e. Sanctuary, followed by University Song, NSS Song and exercises.

**Dr. Vishwambhar Choudhari and Adv. Asim Sarode inaugurated the yearly activities of the department**



participated in the tree plantation activity. There will be regular monitoring and recording of the growth of these trees planted.

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
## 3. Swachata Pakhwada (1<sup>st</sup> August to 15<sup>th</sup> August 2017)

- 3rd August 2017- 'Classroom Cleaning' - The NSS volunteers cleaned college campus and classrooms.




- 5th to 12th August 2017- Display of these expressions (posters, poems and slogans ) on college notice board





### 14. YOUTH DAY CELEBRATIONS-


**15. VALEDICTORY FUNCTION-**


Day 1 – Friday, 1<sup>st</sup> December 2017



**Sanitary Napkin Collection Campaign- 'Kaho Na Pad Hai'**

On 24<sup>th</sup> Jan 2018, MJ Jyonita Deshmukh and Show Producer Sanika Mutalik of 95 Big FM were at St. Mira's College for the Sanitary Napkin Collection Campaign- 'Kaho Na Pad Hai'. The Principal Dr. Gulshan Gidwani felicitated our guests from 95Big FM with literature of the Sadhu Vaswani Mission and campus harvested manure.
